

REGULATIONS

13TH ANDORRA OPEN 2026

VALL D'ORDINO, 27 AND 28 JUNE 2026

With the aim of better organizing the International Open to be held at the Vall d'Ordino course, the Organizing Committee has set a preliminary pre-registration deadline of 18th May 2026. The pre-registration period will be used to determine the approximate number of participants in the tournament, especially those from other FIPPA associations, and to estimate the potential scale of the event.

The final deadline for registrations is 1st June 2026.

Pre-registered players—who must register through their federations or associations—will have priority and will be guaranteed a place provided they meet the previously established requirements. If a FIPPA member association exceeds the suggested limit of available places, every effort will be made to accommodate players in the likely case of vacancies from other FIPPA organizations.

Initial places available for player registrations are:

- 10 players per FIPPA member organization
- 40 players affiliated with the AAPP
- 5 places reserved for the Organizing Committee
- 2 places reserved for the Competition Committee

AAPP players: Subject to availability, places are allocated by order of the most recently completed ranking and, within that order, to players whose Andorran license fee has been paid. The registration date will not be considered. They must register through the AAPP.

All players must have a valid and active federation license at the time of registration and throughout the competition.

1.- COURSE AND DATES

The 13th Andorra Open will take place at the Vall d'Ordino course on Saturday 27th and Sunday 28th June 2026.

EPPA/FIPPA Rules will be used.

2.- CATEGORIES

The following categories are established:

- Absolute
- Women
- Senior
- Junior

3.- TOURNAMENT FORMAT AND SCHEDULE

Tournament format Strokeplay scratch, 54 holes, 3 rounds.

Regulations Rules according to current FIPPA regulations.

Friday 26th

Practice rounds until 12:00 or until 18:00 if there is no start time. The course will then be closed and players must leave immediately.

20:00 Welcome ceremony.

Saturday 27th

Two rounds, 36 holes (shotgun start). Depending on participation, there may be different start times; these will be communicated in advance.

Sunday 28th

Final round, 18 holes (shotgun start). Depending on participation, there may be different start times; these will be communicated in advance.

At the end, closing ceremony and aperitif.

We suggest that players coming from abroad by plane, book their return flights for Monday 29th, in case adverse weather conditions cause delays to the starts.

If there are fewer participants or depending on weather conditions or to ensure better play, the Competition Committee reserves the right to make changes.

4.- PRIZES

Absolute: Champion, Sub-Champion, 3rd place, 4th place and 5th place.

Women: Champion, Sub-Champion, 3rd place.

Senior: Champion, Sub-Champion, 3rd place and 4th place.

Junior: Champion.

A gift will be given to the 3 best players aged 70+ who have not received any of the prizes corresponding to the above categories.

We inform players that, in accordance with FIPPA regulations regarding cash prizes in international tournaments, the Andorra Open cash prizes will be awarded to the best-ranked players in each category as follows:

Absolute:

Champion	500 EUR + Trophy
Sub-Champion	400 EUR + Trophy
3rd place	300 EUR + Medal
4th place	200 EUR + Medal
5th place	100 EUR + Medal

Women:

Champion	200 EUR + Trophy
Sub-Champion	150 EUR + Trophy
3rd place	100 EUR + Medal

Senior:

Champion	250 EUR + Trophy
Sub-Champion	200 EUR + Trophy
3rd place	150 EUR + Medal
4th place	100 EUR + Medal

Junior:

Champion

Trophy

Applicable tax withholdings will be deducted from prize amounts in accordance with current legislation.

A player may only receive one prize: the one with the highest value in euros.

To award cash prizes, a minimum of 50 players is required in the Absolute category and a minimum of 6 participants in the Women and Senior categories. Junior Champion requires a minimum of 3 participants in the category.

Players under 18 years of age may only receive a gift voucher.

5.- TIE-BREAKS

In the event of a tie for first place in the Absolute, Women or Senior category, it will be resolved by a playoff starting on hole 1 of the course and decided under sudden-death format.

In the event of a tie in any of the standings, the prize for each player will be the result of splitting the accumulated corresponding prizes among those players with the same score. Trophies will be decided based on the best score in the final round. If the tie remains, it will be decided using that final scorecard, starting from hole 18 down to hole 1 to break it. If the tie persists, it will be decided by draw.

6.- REGISTRATIONS

It is essential that players who wish to register do it through their respective associations or federations. Player registrations will not be effective until their association or federation notifies us.

- Registration fee: 90 EUR
- Fee for affiliated players with an Andorran license: 80 EUR
- Fee for juniors: 65 EUR
- Fee for juniors with an Andorran license: 55 EUR

The registration must include:

- First and last name
- Polo size (unisex)
- Junior or Senior
- 1st or 2nd start time (if there are multiple starts)
- If you are coming with companions: how many, whether they will have lunch on Saturday, and whether they will stay for the Sunday ceremony. Companions lunch will be at the players menu price.

The fee includes Friday practice rounds, polo shirt, 3 competition rounds, Saturday lunch, Sunday closing ceremony with aperitif, and the contribution to FIPPA.

There will be a special price of 10 EUR/day for training green fees from Monday to Thursday (18 holes).

7.- ORGANIZING COMMITTEE

The Organizing Committee will be made up of members of the AAPP Board specifically appointed for this purpose and will have the support of a representative of the course. The cancellation of the event prior to its celebration is the responsibility of this committee, considering the decision protocol for suspending official events due to adverse weather conditions in the AAPP General Regulations, where applicable, and, failing that, those of the FCPP.

8.- COMPETITION COMMITTEE

It must always be an odd number, with a minimum of 3 members. It will be made up of AAPP members and one member of the host course. The Organizing Committee may decide to increase the number of members, up to a maximum of 5, including players. The committee will be chaired by an AAPP member. The suspension of the event during its celebration is the responsibility of this committee.
